Using your Spiritual Gifts Inventory (the Experience Assessment), your Traits Assessment in this tool, your coach will help you determine your top three Spiritual Gifts....

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Locate your top Spiritual Gift in the *Reference Assessment*. All the gifts are listed alphabetically.
- 2. As you read through the information about your Spiritual Gift, put a check in the box by any item under **Distinctives**, **Traits**, or **Cautions** you feel applies to you. If you begin to sense that the items are not particularly descriptive of you, take a look at what you've identified as your second possible gift. See if there is a better match.
- 3. The Scripture passages at the bottom of the page provide references about the gifts on your list.

This is based on a sample of the tool developed by Bruce Bugbee to provide references for your experience assessment. You will find this, and other assessments for determining your spiritual gifts, in his workbook titled Discover Your Spiritual Gifts the Networked Way.
